SAINTS CELEBRATED THIS WEEK

St James: James (The Greater or Elder) is the patron saint of Spain. He was the son of Zebedee and the brother of John the apostle, both known by the nickname 'Boanerges' or 'Sons of Thunder' because of their fiery tempers. He was one of the first disciples to be called by Christ, one of three witnesses of Christ's transfiguration, his agony in the Garden of Gethsemane and was present at the raising of the daughter of Jairus. He was the first apostle to die for the faith in about 42AD at Jerusalem, and according to tradition his remains are held in the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela.

St Joachim & St Anne: Traditionally the names given, from the 2nd century, to the parents of Our Lady. In the apocryphal Gospel of James, Joachim, a rich member of one of the twelve tribes of Israel and his wife Anne, are childless, greatly saddened and ashamed by this despite their deep faith. An angel promises them a child. At her birth Anne names her Mary, and to fulfill her divine promise, Mary aged three is taken to the temple in Jerusalem, "And Joachim brought the child to the priests, and they blessed her, saying: 'O God of our fathers, bless this child, and give her an everlasting name to be named in all generations'".

St Martha, St Mary St Lazarus: The three were dearest friends of Jesus. Martha and Mary received him at their house at Bethany. The words Jesus speaks at that encounter ('*Mary has chosen the better part*') is taken as the preference for the contemplative, prayerful life over the cares of the world. Martha was present when Jesus raised their brother Lazarus from death, expressing her absolute faith in Christ's divine power.

St Peter Chrysologus: He was born around 380AD in Imola, Italy and chosen as the Archbishop of Ravenna from about 433AD. Famed for his preaching he was known as the 'man of golden speech' (*Chrysologus*) because of his short but rich, to the point, theological homilies. "*The man who wants to play with the devil will not be able to rejoice with Christ*" is attributed to him.

TEACHING TALENTS: The cathedral's education service team is looking for retired or part time qualified teachers to join them.
